Step 1

Formation of teams

Form teams before the start of the project.

Step 2

Meet your team

Further define your goals, mission and operating structure.

Step 3

Explore the problem

Identify challenges and needs to develop a clear problem statement.

Step 4

Develop your solution

Design and test various solutions, creating and elaborating on promising ideas.

Step 5

Define your business model

Explore and validate the business model behind your idea.

Step 6

Successfully pitch your solution

Design your pitch and improve your presentation skills.
